



## **Fabrizio Curcio - Short Biography**

Fabrizio Curcio, a distinguished Italian engineer and civil protection expert, has dedicated nearly 30 years to advancing disaster management and enhancing resilience both in Italy and internationally.

Born in Rome, Curcio earned a Master's degree in Engineering from La Sapienza University, further strengthening his expertise with a Master's in Safety and Protection. Throughout his career, he has participated in numerous courses on safety and risk management, both as a student and instructor, establishing his reputation as a leader in the field.

Curcio's career encompasses several pivotal roles within Italy's national civil protection system. From 1994 to 2006, he served as an officer in the national fire brigade, rising to the highest levels of responsibility in civil protection activities in the following years.

His leadership during critical national emergencies, such as the L'Aquila earthquake (2009), the one that struck central Italy (2016/2017), and the Costa Concordia disaster demonstrated his exceptional ability to coordinate complex rescue operations. His efforts were instrumental in shaping Italy's civil protection system into a highly regarded, multilevel, multidisciplinary organization known for its preparedness and rapid response capabilities.

In 2015, Curcio was appointed Head of the Italian Civil Protection Department (ICPD), a position he held from 2015 to 2017, and again from 2021 until 2024. Under his leadership, the ICPD reformed national legislation to strengthen disaster risk reduction, emergency response, and early warning systems. He has also emphasized the importance of public communication and risk awareness campaigns to enhance community preparedness in the face of disasters.

Curcio has played a key role in integrating technology into civil protection operations, particularly through the use of Earth observation technology within the European Union's Copernicus program. His initiatives modernized Italy's early warning systems and improved emergency response coordination across various levels of government and sectors. Additionally, Curcio has led Italy's participation in the European Union Civil Protection Mechanism, significantly influencing European disaster management frameworks.

Throughout his career, Curcio has managed numerous large-scale emergencies, including coordinating Italy's response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the national vaccination campaign, and the reception of Ukrainian refugees. He also directed relief efforts for severe flooding in the Marche and Romagna regions, where his coordinated actions helped minimize damage and casualties.

Internationally, Curcio has represented Italy in various high-level forums, including those of the United Nations and the European Union, advocating for stronger international cooperation in disaster risk reduction. He has participated in G20 meetings, the Sendai Framework discussions, and numerous UN events, championing improved disaster governance and climate change mitigation strategies.

In recognition of his outstanding contributions to civil protection, Curcio has received numerous awards, including being named an Officer of the Order of Merit of the Italian Republic and a Commander by the Republic of San Marino. He has also been honored with various national and international awards for his exemplary service in disaster management and civil protection.
